- ◆ Photographs must be labeled on the back with name, address and phone number in order to be returned. Please DO NOT write directly on the back of the photo which may cause indentations in the picture.

- ◆ All photos submitted will be displayed at the **Castellani Art Museum on the campus of Niagara University the week of June 17th**. The contest will culminate in an Art Reception at the Castellani Art Museum on **Thursday, June 20th, 2019**.
