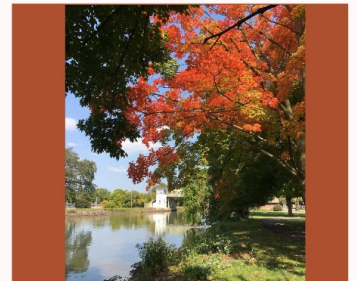

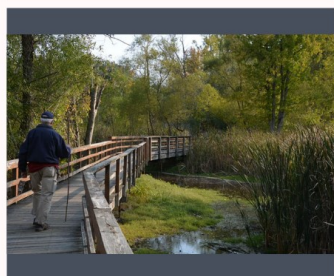

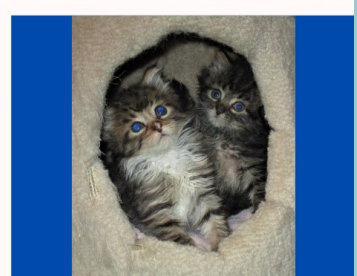


**THE JUDGES AWARDED
